Somebody once asked me if I get in my 10,000 steps walking through our building. Not quite, but it was a reminder: we do have a large building! Just like a home, which always seems to need some kind of maintenance, so a church building needs constant attention. Because our building is large, it requires extra work.

I am thankful to the Facilities Team, which actively tends to our building! Already, the mowers have been mowing the grass – coordinated by our Facilities Team. The boiler has been very, very finicky. Thank you to the Facilities Team for working with our HVAC company to get this all sorted out.

Your pastor noted that the "Comfy Room" (Room 1), actually isn't so comfy, as most of the couches and chairs have sag – when you sit in them, your hips are lower than your knees. For those of us of a certain age, it makes getting out of a seat challenging. Session approved funds to upgrade this room, and Facilities got right on it. The room has been painted (it's lovely!) and new furniture is being ordered. The groups that meet in this room will truly be comfy, thanks to Facilities.

The lights in the Family Life Center are sky high, requiring a lift for any bulbs to be replaced. Yes, currently, one light bulb is out – but Facilities knows about it and is waiting for a second bulb to go out before paying for a lift and changing light bulbs. In your home, if a ceiling light goes out, it's just a matter of standing on chair to replace the bulb. It's a bigger project in the FLC, and Facilities is handling this.

Our Facilities Team oversees all groups, both within our congregation, and from the outside, who use our building. Groups requesting to use our building complete a form, which Facilities reviews and approves (or doesn't), noting the correct fees to receive from the groups.
